The 5th Annual SRSA Undergraduate Poster Session will take place during the 64th Annual Meeting of the Southern Regional Science Association (SRSA), April 3-5, 2025, at the Brown Hotel in Louisville, Kentucky.

This is a great opportunity for undergraduate students to present their research. The SRSA is a regional organization for the advancement of regional science, which is an interdisciplinary field at the intersection of economics, geography, planning, and spatial analysis. However, in the interest of expanding the pool of future regional science researchers, we will consider a relatively broad range of research topics.

The poster session will include a short presentation by each student describing their poster and research, followed by informal browsing and discussion about the posters. Other activities to enhance the experience for the students are also planned.

To apply, students should complete the following and submit via email to rri@mail.wvu.edu. Each student must also have their faculty sponsor submit an email supporting the submission to rri@mail.wvu.edu. **The deadline for submissions is February 14, 2025.**

Applicants will be notified about participation by February 26, 2025. All selected participants will have their registration fee waived. Students will be responsible for their own travel and accommodations and are encouraged to reserve a hotel room early (visit <https://www.srsa.org/conference/>) as the block may sell out.
